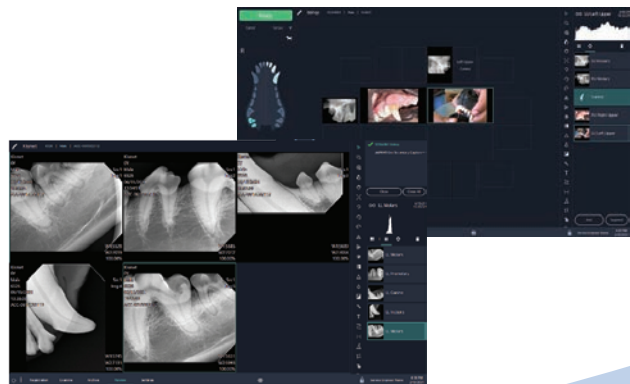

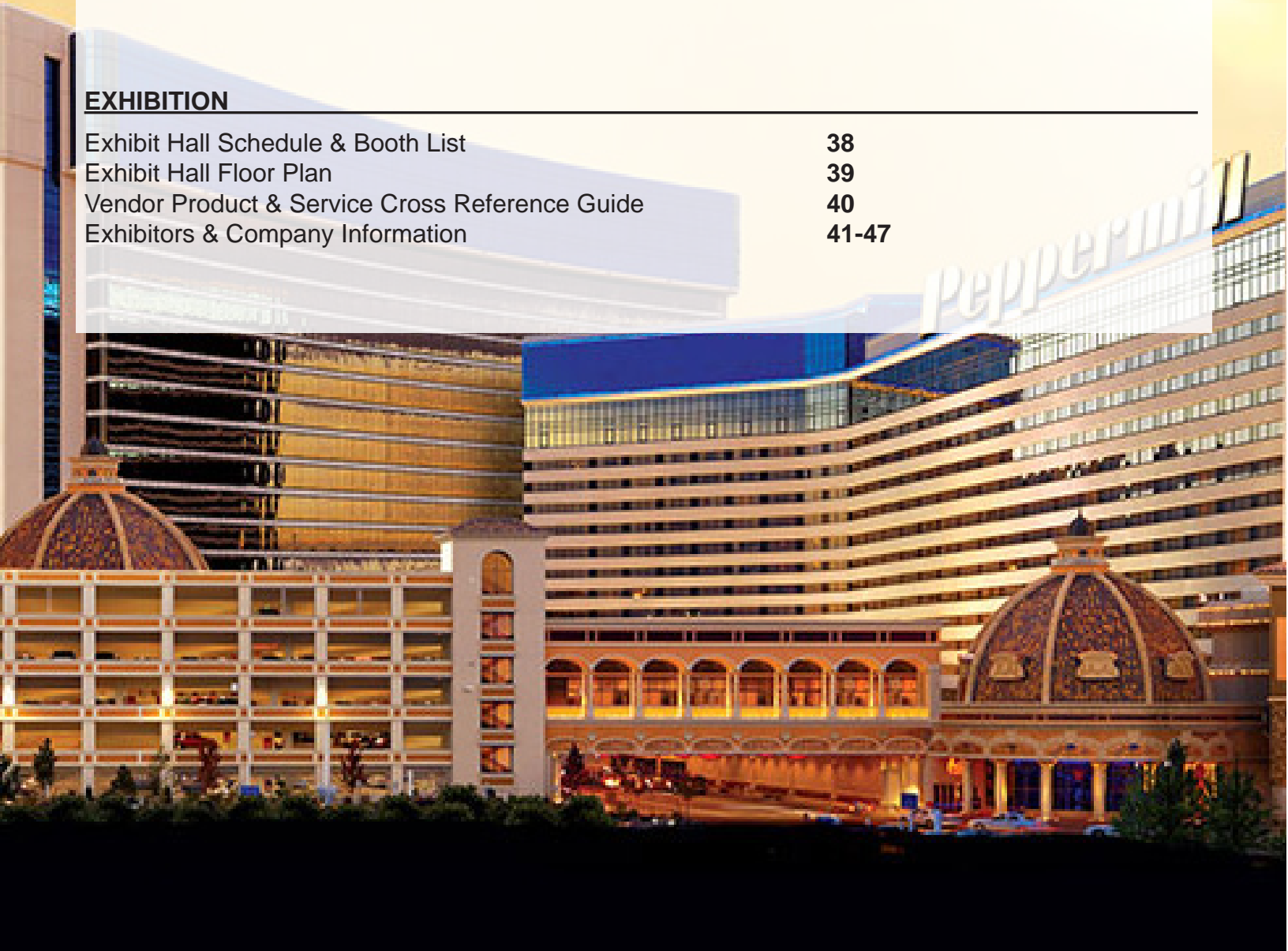

Foundation President's Message

PAYING FORWARD

My passion for companion animal dentistry started in 1986 after attending a weekend wet lab at Dr. Keith Grove's veterinary practice in Vero Beach, Florida. Dr. Grove not only was a veterinarian but a dentist for humans, and a board-certified periodontist. Dr. Grove taught us procedures at his veterinary practice followed by lunch in his human periodontal office. That Sunday's experience opened my eyes wide to the opportunities of companion animal dentistry. Soon I was hooked and thirsted for more information. Fortunately, Drs.' Colin Harvey, Gary Beard, Ben Colmery, Tom Mulligan, Sandy Manfra, Chuck Williams and Don Ross were paying their passion for dentistry forward. These veterinarians became my heroes, sharing their knowledge and clinical techniques to help animals worldwide.

The American Veterinary Dental Society was created in 1976. As more and more practitioners became acquainted with this new field of veterinary medicine; the Academy of Veterinary Dentistry and the American Veterinary Dental College were formed in 1987. As well that year, the Veterinary Dental Forum held its first meeting for the purpose of advancing knowledge, education, awareness, and skills involved in veterinary dentistry. In attendance were veterinarians, veterinary technicians, veterinary students, veterinary staff and anyone else with an interest in veterinary dentistry.

The American Veterinary Dental College (AVDC) certifies specialists that have completed residencies, credentials and passed both the written and practical examinations. To date, the AVDC has certified 203 non-species specific and 23 Equine veterinary dental specialists. In 2022 a record number of specialists (22) became Board Certified in Veterinary Dentistry.

The college is also responsible for managing the Veterinary Oral Health Council. A forward-thinking group of early AVDC diplomates developed and instituted a seal of acceptance for veterinary dental products whose research proved they had product claims for significant reduction in plaque and/or tartar accumulation.

In 2016 the American Veterinary Dental Society, the Journal of Veterinary Dentistry and the Veterinary Dental Forum merged into the Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry. The Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry's three goals include education, research, and outreach. Current programs that are supported by the Foundation include:

- Board certified veterinary dentists adopting student chapters at most of the accredited veterinary schools.
- The Make Me Smile program delivering veterinary dental training and new equipment to shelters and Humane Society veterinarians for the purpose of making pets healthier and more adoptable.
- Awarding multiple yearly grants for veterinary dental research. and the outreach program operates worldwide.
- Facilitating the annual Veterinary Dental Forum including three years of forward planning.
- Publishing the Journal of Veterinary Dentistry.
- Annually evaluating and equipping certified veterinary universities in need of dental equipment.

Dr. Perry Klokkevold, DDS, MS, FACD



Dr. Perry Klokkevold received his dental degree from UCSF School of Dentistry. He completed all of his postdoctoral clinical training and earned a master's degree from UCLA School of Dentistry. He received certificates in Hospital Dentistry from the UCLA General Practice Residency, in Periodontics from the UCLA Postgraduate Periodontics Residency and in Dental Implant Surgery from the UCLA Surgical Implant Fellowship program.

Dr. Klokkevold is Professor of Clinical Dentistry in the Section of Periodontics at the UCLA School of Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology, a Faculty Member of Omicron Kappa Upsilon (OKU) Dental Honor Society and a Fellow of the American College of Dentists. Currently, Dr. Klokkevold serves as Program Director of the UCLA Postgraduate Periodontics Residency program (1995-present) and previously served as Program Director of the UCLA Hospital

Dentistry General Practice Residency program (1987-1992). He currently serves as President for the California Society of Periodontists.

Dr. Klokkevold's practice and teaching activities are limited to the specialty of periodontics and surgical dental implant therapy since 1995. He has lectured on several periodontal and implant-related topics including periodontal medicine, risk assessment, bone augmentation and dental implant therapy. He serves as a Reviewer for multiple journals and has been invited to serve as an Expert Consultant for World Workshops and International Conferences. He has published over 60 articles and more than 100 book chapters on periodontics, periodontal medicine, bone regeneration and all aspects of dental implant therapy. He is an author and Co-Editor of Carranza's Clinical Periodontology, 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th editions and the forthcoming Newman and Carranza's Clinical Periodontology and Implant Therapy, 14th edition.

Dr. Arnaud Bewley is a fellowship trained head and neck cancer and reconstructive surgeon whose practice focuses on the comprehensive management of tumors of the head and neck. This primarily involves the surgical management of benign and malignant tumors of the face, mouth, throat, neck, and thyroid. He has a special interest in using microvascular free-flap techniques to reconstruct defects caused by tumor removal, in order to maximize a patient's post-operative function.

Dr. Klokkevold is Professor of Clinical Dentistry in the Section of Periodontics at the UCLA School of Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology, a Faculty Member of Omicron Kappa Upsilon (OKU) Dental Honor Society and a Fellow of the American College of Dentists. Currently, Dr. Klokkevold serves as Program Director of the UCLA Postgraduate Periodontics Residency program (1995-present) and previously served as Program Director of the UCLA Hospital Dentistry General Practice Residency program (1987-1992). He currently serves as President for the California Society of Periodontists.

Dr. Klokkevold's practice and teaching activities are limited to the specialty of periodontics and surgical dental implant therapy since 1995. He has lectured on several periodontal and implant-related topics including periodontal medicine, risk assessment, bone augmentation and dental implant therapy. He serves as a Reviewer for multiple journals and has been invited to serve as an Expert Consultant for World Workshops and International Conferences. He has published over 60 articles and more than 100 book chapters on periodontics, periodontal medicine, bone regeneration and all aspects of dental implant therapy. 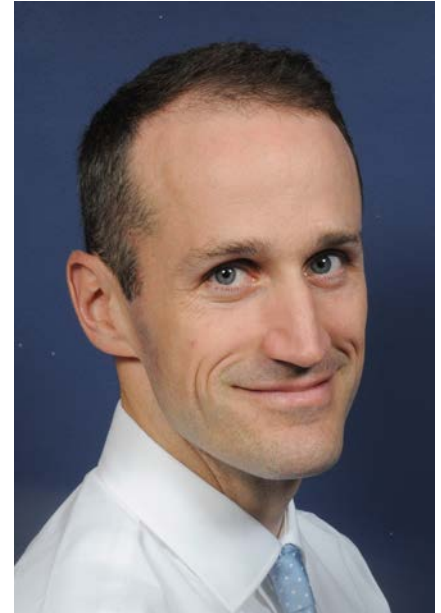

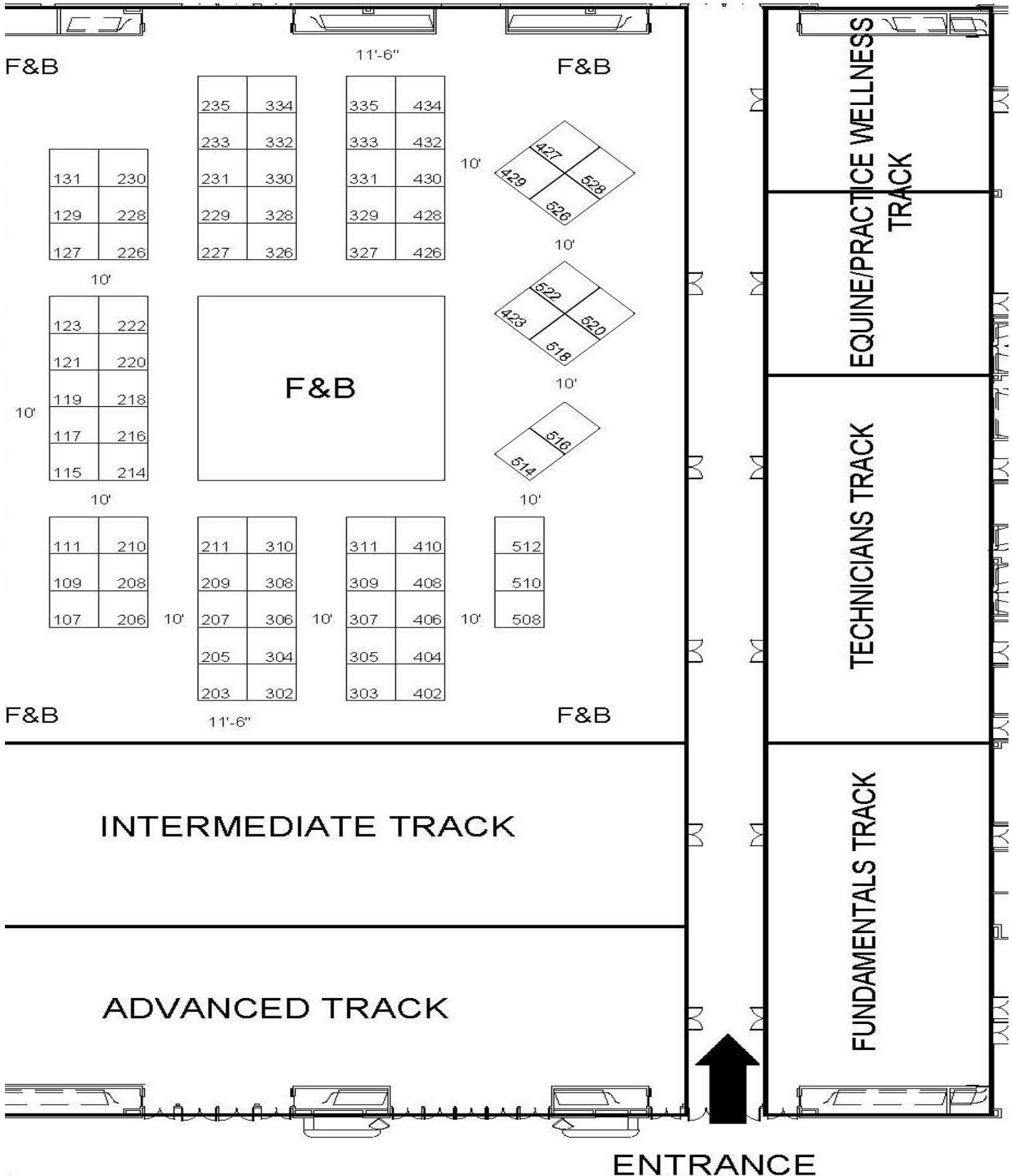

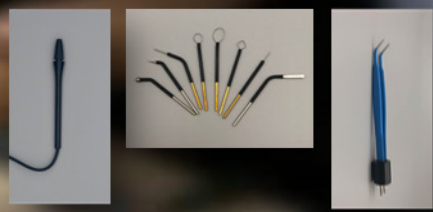
